## A MESSAGE FROM RABBI NEIL



### A Summer of Change

As Cantor Lianna prepares to move on from our community in June, I want to take this opportunity to thank her for the last three years – for the wonderful music, for the family services, for the new Tashlich ceremony, for holding the community through my Sabbatical, for her unique clergy perspective and ideas, for new ways of approaching our tradition, and for so much more. Working with her has been a pleasure and while we are sad to see her leave Santa Fe, we're very excited for her own professional and personal journey in Chicago.

As we look to the summer and beyond, we're very lucky that Brian Serle will be our new Director of Education, and you'll hear more about him soon. In terms of services, both Aaron Wolf and Rabbi Jenny will be providing occasional musical accompaniment, supporting our wondrous Fred Milder who so masterfully provides instrumentation every week. In terms of Friday evening services, you'll also see occasional lay-led services and guest sermons, and if there is a fifth Friday night service in a month, that will be a Reflective and Meditative service, a spiritual format which has proven to be popular since they started a year ago.

Shabbat mornings will see the most dramatic development, from the return of the explanatory service to a monthly service led by and for specific religious school classes. Lay leaders will also help once a month and if there is a fifth Shabbat morning service in a month, that will be dedicated to new liturgy, such as poems and prayers written by members, or even exploring new forms of traditional prayers that meet the needs of our ever-changing community.

Before all of that, we invite you to join us for our Tikkun Leil Shavuot on June 11th, which is one of our largest educational gatherings of the year. Shavuot itself is a wonderful example of Judaism developing as times change - originally a harvest festival, it was given a new focus as the celebration of the giving of Torah on Sinai, so instead of gleaning our crops by day, we study long into the night (and host our annual cheesecake competition!). This year, the theme of our Tikkun Leil is Jewish Boundaries. We will look at how Judaism originally defined and enforced certain boundaries – legal, gender, physical, spiritual, identity – and those boundaries have shifted over time. It promises to be a fascinating evening of learning for people of all levels of Jewish knowledge, and I really hope that you can join us in-person or online.

## A MESSAGE FROM CANTOR LIANNA



**Pirkei Avot, the tractate of the Mishnah dealing with the Wisdom of our Ancestors, opens by saying, “Moses received the Torah at Sinai and transmitted it to Joshua, Joshua to the elders, and the elders to the prophets, and the prophets to the Members of the Great Assembly.”**

**This verse establishes Shalshet haKabbalah, the chain of tradition, that links Jews and Jewish knowledge from time immemorial. Rav Joseph Soloveichik explains this further, saying “Hands are linked; generations are united. One society encompasses past, present and future.” Whenever I pray, I see my prayers connecting me to all the people before me, all the people who will come after me, and all the people around the world who are connecting to these same prayers, even if we might all do them differently or understand them differently. I love being a Jewish educator because I can empower people to create links for themselves to the chain of tradition; to find their own role in their community, and to learn more about their Jewish self.**

**The religious school recently traveled to Las Vegas, New Mexico, to learn about the history of Jewish New Mexico and the people that came before them and those who are working to continue the community today. At Montefiore Cemetery, which is the oldest Jewish cemetery in New Mexico and dates back to 1883, we buried unusable prayer books and bibles, in an ancient Jewish practice known as geniza.**

**As we interred the books, I shared the words above from Pirkei Avot 1:1. The moment resonated not only with the traditions that were passed into and through the books, which were so well loved and used that they couldn’t serve us any more, but also with the continuity of the next generation of New Mexico’s Jewish community standing in the place where the first generation of New Mexico’s Jewish community was buried.**

**As my departure from TBS approaches, I am feeling many complicated emotions. I am excited about taking the next steps in my career and pursuing a new opportunity, and I will also miss many people and places here in Santa Fe. But I feel good knowing that TBS’ unique chain of tradition began many years before I got here, and will continue to be here many years after I leave. I know that it is in good hands, and that my work has strengthened and added links to the chain.**

**Thank you for allowing me to link my hands with yours for the last three years - we are now and forever part of a united chain of tradition. I am grateful to have been part of the TBS story and that TBS will forever be part of my story. Please make sure to come say goodbye at an Ice Cream Social on Sunday, June 2nd, from 3:00-5:00, at Cowgirl from 6:00-8:00 on Tuesday, June 4th, or at my final Kabbalat Shabbat service on Friday, June 7th at 6:30 PM. And if you find yourself in Chicago’s North Shore, please feel free to reach out!**

## A MESSAGE FROM OUR PRESIDENT



I am carving out time to write this message in the midst of major Passover preparations. For me it is about cleaning out the pantry, freezer and refrigerator, remembering my grandmother's attention to detail and my great-grandmother making gefilte fish from scratch. Trying to figure out meaningful ways to create tradition (and FUN) for my grandson and incorporating relevant issues into this year's Seder. I think about the many ways the world still needs redemption. It can be a despairing exercise, but if I let that paralyzing emotion overtake my "process", it will be difficult to muster the energy to do my part to build the better world we all envision. To me, this means Passover is also an important time for the Jewish people to think about hope. Fulfilling our hopes for redemption requires working together; the women in the Exodus story – the midwives, Miriam, Yocheved (Moses's mother) and Pharaoh's daughter – show us the power of joining together and saying "NO" to the current reality and "YES" to the possibility of a better future.

We have hired a wonderful Education Director whose love of children and Judaism will be a blessing to our community.

We did not want to rush into replacing our beloved Cantor Lianna so in the coming months leading up to the High Holy Days, we will be treated to lay leader volunteers helping Rabbi Neil to make our services spiritual and meaningful. May our ancient stories of liberation from Egypt sustain our hope in every generation.

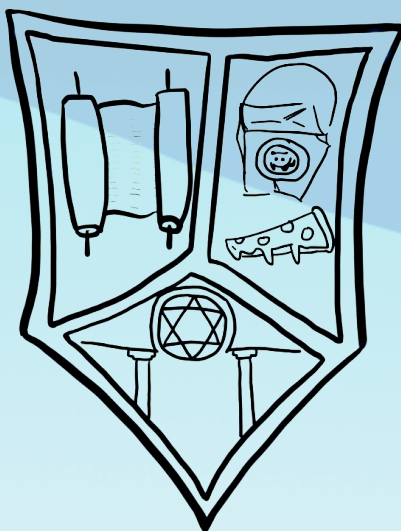
## HOCHBERG ACADEMY

## BOOK NOTES:

{Occasional book reviews by Library Committee Members}



**Nothing Sacred: the Truth about Judaism, by Douglas Rushkoff  
(Three Rivers Press, 2004)**

I walked into the TBS library, and there was a book sitting on the table with a title that shocked and intrigued me. How dare he? Who is this guy anyway? Does this book even belong in a Jewish library? My mind was full of questions without even a trace of any answers. The only way for me to find resolution was to read it. That way I could ascertain for myself the book's value, get the author's perspective, and see if he has answers, or at least ideas, that could put me on an inquisitive and thoughtful path concerning my own Jewish beliefs. The beginning chapters were very disturbing to me, but as I kept reading, the story he told became very compelling. The "history" of the Jewish people and the evolution of our G-d was very educational. He wrote of the three cornerstones of Judaism – iconoclasm, monotheism, and social justice. Judaism was born out of a willingness to challenge our beliefs. Believing in one G-d for this contentious people was a big leap and took many years and many setbacks. However, once that belief was strongly established, G-d then receded from human affairs. It became the people's duty to care for one another, not just family but especially strangers. Scientific breakthroughs in the 1800's challenged our Creation and Sinai stories. Was the Torah written by G-d? What should we believe? Should we assimilate and become more like our neighbors? After the Holocaust, who among us still believes in G-d? We need Israel. Was it our reward for the supreme sacrifice? Should we shun intermarriage? Are we a race or a religion? What actions do we take to protect Judaism? Can we evolve and remain recognizable? So many paths before us, so many crises. David Rushkoff answered a lot of the questions I didn't know I had. I learned about a type of Judaism I had never heard of previously, Humanistic. He is a thoughtful, knowledgeable author.

In response to one of my questions above, does this book belong in a Jewish library, the answer is both yes and no. Yes, it should be part of our collection, and no, because it should spend more of its time in congregants' homes being enjoyed and pondered!
