A MESSAGE FROM RABBI NEIL

A TIME TO RETURN

The overriding theme of the High Holy Days is teshuvah, which is usually translated as repentance, but which comes from the root “to return,” since repentance is an act of returning to our truest selves, and to the best relationships we can have with other people and with God. Although the pandemic is not yet over, an overwhelming majority of our members have been vaccinated several times, and the COVID-19 case numbers are down, which means that this year we are returning to in-person services for the High Holy Days. For many people, this is wonderful news, and we expect a significant number of people to join us for High Holy Day services this year. For others, we appreciate that there will still be nervousness about being in an enclosed space with so many people.

This is *a* time to return, not *the* time to return. In D’varim Rabbah, Rabbi Shmuel bar Nachman says that “the gates of prayer are sometimes open and sometimes closed, but the gates of repentance are always open.” In Reflection on Sin, Pain, Hope and the True Way, Franz Kafka writes that “only our concept of time makes it possible to speak of the Day of Judgment by that name; in reality it is a summary court in perpetual session.” In other words, although Elul, Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur are the quintessential time for returning, they are not the only time. Indeed, in Talmud (Shabbat 153a), Rabbi Eliezer tells his students to repent one day before their death. They reply that it’s impossible to know the date of one’s death, to which he responds “All the more reason to repent today...” Every day, therefore, is the day to return, to atone, but we have to be ready emotionally. We cannot just dive into it if the circumstances aren’t right for us.

Of course, it is wonderful to be physically in the presence of other community members over the High Holy Days, but it’s not essential, especially because the pandemic still very much continues. For those who are not yet comfortable being around large numbers of people (or for those who apparently enjoyed online Erev Rosh Hashanah services in their PJs while sipping margaritas!), all of our services will also be streamed online. If you feel like you really want to be in community but not around so many people, you could perhaps attend our Selichot service, or our Shabbat Shuvah service, both of which are beautiful services that carry the themes and tunes of the High Holy Days without hundreds of people present. If you would be more comfortable attending an outdoor High Holy Day service, our Tashlich service in the afternoon of Second Day Rosh Hashanah might well be perfect for you. On Yom Kippur, there will be some services, discussions and study sessions in-person, and some only online, so that everyone can participate in differing ways. We will even be providing packs for study and reflection for those who wish to stay on site between those services, and will give space around the site for private reflection, meditation and prayer. These High Holy Days are an emotional time for our community. Our intention is to help keep the gates of repentance open for everyone in differing ways, and we look forward to seeing you in one of the many differing ways over this time of returning.

Shanah Tovah – a happy and healthy New Year.

A MESSAGE FROM CANTOR LIANNA

THE SOUNDS OF THE HIGH HOLIDAYS

My first real foray into synagogue music was the High Holy Day choir at my home congregation, Temple B'rith Kodesh in Rochester, NY, which I joined right after my Bat Mitzvah. From high up in the choir loft, I learned the haunting harmonies of Avinu Malkeinu and the melodies that signify the Days of Awe. Now, as a cantor, I see how much preparation and planning go into the holidays, and sometimes while poring over outlines or sorting sheet music, I lose sight of the holiness among the minutia. But every year, the first choir rehearsal awakens me to the sacredness of coming together, of how we can raise our voices together in beautiful music and worship.

The 12th-century rabbinic scholar Maimonides wrote that the sound of the shofar is a symbol, saying “Awake you sleepers from your sleep! Rouse yourself from your slumber! Examine your deeds, return in repentance, and remember your Creator (Mishneh Torah, Hilchot Teshuvah 3:4).” When we experience the High Holy Days, we experience them through very specific sounds- not only the blast of the shofar, but specific melodies and motifs. We tap our hearts and express our failings to the rhythmic repetition of Ashamnu. We rejoice in the birth of a new year when we hear the joyful lilting of the “Shana Tova” melody.

If the sounds of the holidays are so important, does it matter how exactly we hear them? In the Talmud, in Rosh Hashana 27b, it talks about whether someone who doesn't hear the blasts of a shofar directly can be counted as having fulfilled the mitzvah. The rabbis ruled that the answer is yes: If you hear the shofar sounded into a jug or through a window, it counts as long as your heart has set the right intention. Long before streaming worship was popular, Temple B'rith Kodesh broadcast their services over the radio so that people who couldn't physically come to synagogue could still have a meaningful High Holy Days. Do you think Rosh Hashanah on the radio fulfills the obligations? Maybe on these strange, not-quite-post-COVID High Holy Days, the intention is more important than the modality of the experience. Whether we come in person or watch online, the important thing about these High Holy Days is that we allow their distinctive sound to awaken our hearts, to cause us to take inventory of our soul, and to think about how we can do better and make the world a sweeter place for all of us in the year to come.

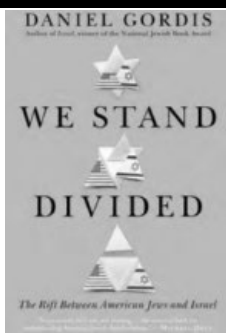
BAT MITZVAH

RECENT PAST EVENTS

FIGHTING FOR OUR DEMOCRACY

On July 28, we co-sponsored and co-coordinated with the Social Justice Committee a talk by Rachel Laser, CEO of Americans United for Separation of Church and State. This event was well attended and very well received.

GERSHWIN: MUSIC AND MIND OF A GENIUS

On August 4, we co-sponsored with the Distinguished Lecture series a lecture and performance by Dr. Richard Kogan about George Gershwin. He spoke about this composer from a psychiatric perspective and played several of his works – Dr Kogan is a world-class performer. The event was sold out and was met with a standing ovation!

YOSSEL'S JOURNEY: A BOOK TALK WITH JOHNSON YAZZIE

On August 19, Johnson Yazzie discussed his book *Yossel's Journey*. Yazzie, who was born on the Navajo Nation in Pinon, Arizona, has had an extensive career as an artist and illustrator. In *Yossel's Journey*, a boy named Yossel flees with his family from anti-Jewish Russian pogroms in the Nineteenth century. They settle in the American Southwest, where he forges a friendship with a Native Navajo boy named Thomas.

AND TRUTH SHALL GROW FROM THE GROUND

On August 23 at 7:00 pm, Rabbi Geoffrey Dennis spoke at TBS about "Why Jews Are Shamans in Sportswear" Rabbi Dennis, who has written two books - *The Encyclopedia of Jewish Myth, Magic, and Mysticism* (2007), and *Sefer Ha'Bahir: Selections From the Book of Brilliance* (2017) shared the lesser known spiritual elements of the Jewish tradition.

BUILDING SINGING COMMUNITIES

On August 29 at 6:00 pm, Joey Weisenberg presented a workshop on incorporating singing into Jewish communities. He is the founder of Hadar's Rising Song Institute, which aims to cultivate the grassroots musical-spiritual creativity of the Jewish people.

UPCOMING EVENTS

RAOUL WALLENBERG: A HERO FOR OUR TIME

On September 11, the film *The Case of Raul Wallenberg- Savior and Victim* will be screened live at the Center for Contemporary Arts and also be made available to stream online on Sep 11 and Sep 12 through the Santa Fe Jewish Film Festival platform. A panel discussion and Q&A with experts on the topic will follow the screening. Wallenberg, a Swedish humanitarian, saved thousands of Jews in German-occupied Hungary during the Holocaust. Esther Kovari, long-time congregant of Temple Beth Shalom, will introduce the program. Kovari's mother and family were saved by Wallenberg. Presented by The Wallenberg Group with the Adult Education Programs Committee of TBS, in collaboration with the Santa Fe Jewish Film Festival and Global Santa Fe.

MULTI-GENERATIONAL STORY-TELLING WORKSHOP

On October 23 Batya Podos, an ordained Maggid (Jewish storyteller, teacher, and spiritual leader) from Congregation Nahalat Shalom in Albuquerque, will present this workshop.

SOCIAL JUSTICE COMMITTEE

Pride Shabbat – Friday August 26

In conjunction with a small committee, we coordinated our first Pride Shabbat! We lined up a few TBS members to speak about their experiences in support of our being a congregation that not only welcomes, but also affirms LGBTQ+ identities and experiences.

NEW PROJECTS AND UPCOMING EVENTS

Queer Group at TBS

Saroj Baxter and Devin Egber have started working toward inviting LGBTQ+ members of TBS to a monthly meeting. The purpose is to offer support, get to know the community, and receive feedback on how to be more affirming.

Afghan Refugee Resettlement

The Najibs are progressing with getting more licensed drivers, better jobs, and English language skills. Some of us are helping them learn English. We are helping with other Afghan families as well and cognizant of the strain the situation in Albuquerque is causing. We are informally sponsoring the Najibs – our contribution is still with Lutheran Family Services, reserved for when we officially are assigned a family to sponsor.

We will hold a Mitzvah Fair on November 20th. More info to come!

Social Justice Committee

We are delighted to welcome Saroj as our new committee chair. We have gained some new members in the past few months. Saroj and the committee are continuing to develop our social justice focus for the upcoming year. Our goal is to continue to make TBS a welcoming and affirming community for all people. This includes promoting authentic racial affinity spaces and affirmation of LGBTQ+ identities.

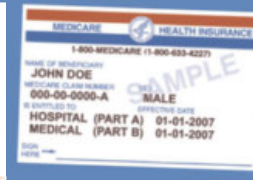
